Central Kitsap High School is a comprehensive, public, four-year high school with an approximate **2019** enrollment of **1,450** students. The Central Kitsap area is across Puget Sound from Seattle, Washington, and is the home of the Trident Submarine Base, Naval Undersea Warfare Engineering Station, and the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard. The presence of these military bases contributes to the culturally and economically diverse population served by Central Kitsap High School. The demographics of our school are: 26% free/reduced lunch, 11.17 % Hispanic/Latino, 0.50% American Indian/Alaska Native, 8.11% Asian, 4.31% Black/African American, 1.37% Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander, 58% White and 15.42 of more than one race or multiracial.

Academic Programs

Central Kitsap High School currently operates on a six-period day, allowing students the scheduling flexibility to explore a variety of courses. The school year for students is divided into two semesters, consisting of ninety school days each. Grade placement is determined by credits earned. Central Kitsap High School is accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission.

The following requirements are in place to meet state and Central Kitsap School District graduation requirements and are recorded at the end of the transcript as Additional State Requirements: **Certificate of Academic Achievement (CAA)**: Passing the state required testing in English Language Arts and Math. **High School & Beyond Plan**: An educational plan of the student's high school experience, including planning for their post-secondary education.

Academic Grading and Class Standing

Grading is based on a 4.0 scale. Minimum passing grade is a D (1.0). Pass/Fail, Credit/No Credit, and Satisfactory. Unsatisfactory marks may also be used. Class Rank is determined by Grade Point Average in grades 9-12. **Class Rank and GPA are not weighted.**

Based on the 2019 **Washington Post**, CK High School is ranked as the 2,415th public high school in the nation with a Challenge Index of 2.142. For the past seventeen consecutive years, CKHS was placed in the top fifteen percent of all the nation's public high schools, measured by its success on state-required tests, graduation and how well they prepare students for college.

Honors Programs

The Distinguished Scholar Program requires a rigorous academic course of study with fifteen semesters of Honors or Advanced Placement courses. A Distinguished Scholar student has maintained a **3.4** cumulative GPA throughout high school. Students awarded valedictorian or salutatorian honors must also have earned Distinguished Scholar designation. Students receive an **Academic Letter** by earning a cumulative **GPA of 3.4** through the first semester of the sophomore year. Students who maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.4 through their 7th semester are awarded the Scholar Honor Cord.

Running Start & College in High School

The Washington State Legislature has mandated legislation that allows high school juniors and seniors to enroll at community colleges and earn high school and college credits simultaneously. This program is called **Running Start**. A "CC" will precede the course code number on the transcript. Central Kitsap also offers a College in the High School program. Courses in the current cycle include Pre-Calculus and Calculus.
