

CKHS Request for Letter of Recommendation

Student's Responsibilities

- Make sure the person you ask to write your letter knows you well.
- Make personal contact (appointment) with the person; do not leave the request in a mailbox
- Give the writer at least **FOUR WEEKS** notice.
- Make sure you self-promote and communicate thoroughly.

Writer's Responsibilities

- Please consider the following in your letter: Scholastic ability, leadership qualities, cooperation, initiative, motivation, maturity, personality, integrity and reaction to criticism.
- You may also wish to include: examples of anecdotes, reasons why the student is qualified and your phone number or email address in case further information is needed.
- If a question is not relevant to you, you may skip that question.
